Welcome to the first Regional Alliance for Healthy Schools (RAHS) e-newsletter!

The Regional Alliance for Healthy Schools at Michigan Medicine consists of the School-Based Health Centers (SBHC) of the University of Michigan. RAHS has provided adolescent health services in Washtenaw County for 21 years and has now expanded to Genesee County. This quarterly communication will serve as an opportunity to update our community partners about RAHS news as well as upcoming programming and events.



The RAHS expansion into Genesee County is well underway. We have established five school-based health centers in the Flint community at Beecher Community High School, Carman-Ainsworth High School, Kearsley High School, Northwestern High School, and Richfield Public School Academy. These new health centers join the six existing Washtenaw County sites at Lincoln High School, Lincoln Middle School, Pathways to Success Academic Campus, Scarlett Middle/Mitchell Elementary Schools, Ypsilanti Community High School, and Ypsilanti Community Middle School.

In addition to providing fully comprehensive physical health, mental health, and prevention services, RAHS offers coordination for ongoing services for youth that need long term care. Our school-based health centers strive to meet the unmet health needs of youth, eliminating barriers to services and coordinating with PCPs for continuity of care.

- Physical Exams
- Sick Visits
- Immunizations
- Nutrition Counseling
- Health & Fitness Education Programs
- STI and Pregnancy Testing
- Mental Health Services and Psychotherapy
- Referrals for Community Resources
- Insurance Enrollment
