First and foremost, ALL GRADES ARE FROZEN as of March 12th! We will not have a 3rd quarter. When we return to school, all work completed through March 12th will be rolled into a 2nd semester grade. All students can log into StudentVue to check if they had any missing work that was not completed before the shutdown due to an absence. Complete those assignments and stay in contact with your teachers through email.

At this time, Kearsley High School will not require additional graded work at home, however, we strongly encourage you to utilize the many learning activities recommended below. There will be more and more content specific online resources available on the main page of the district website.

- **Khan Academy** <https://www.khanacademy.org>
All students free standards =aligned practice and lessons in math, grammar, reading, science, history, AP, SAT and more. Juniors already have accounts set up and should be familiar with this site.
- **Exact Path** <https://www.edmentum.com>
Freshmen and sophomores can work on Exact Path. Practice both the reading and math skills (even if you have not used the math activities before, use them now). Email your English teacher if you need your login information - it will be the same for reading and math.
- **Michigan Virtual University** <https://lc.michiganvirtual.org/courses/>
Students can take many of the same courses they take at KHS on Michigan Virtual University for free. For the duration of the closure, MVU will offer content to over 70 high-quality courses free to student and parents as a resource to support student learning. This course content includes digital lessons, however, it does not include assessments and is non-credit bearing.

Students, please do not stress about your grades. Utilize the “enrichment” programs I recommended above as much as possible to help keep your mind active and overcome boredom. And finally, read, read, read . . . a book, magazine, newspaper. Write in a journal every day, exercise, research things you are interested in, play board games, and spend quality time with your family.

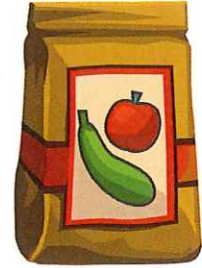
During the state mandated shutdown of all schools, Kearsley Community Schools is still here for our students and families to help in any way that we can. Here is information that may be of help:

Options for Internet Access

Everyoneon.org – <https://www.everyoneon.org> National nonprofit that creates social and economic opportunities by connecting everyone to the internet. Everyone works closely with schools, public housing communities, and other diverse organizations.

Comcast – <https://wifi.xfinity.com/> Comcast has increased the speeds of its Internet Essentials home internet service from 15/2 Mbps to 25/3 Mbps. Households who enroll now will be eligible for 60 days of complimentary service. Also, Internet Essentials provides a \$9.95 per month, home internet service exclusively to low-income households. Comcast is also making its Xfinity Wi-Fi hotspots free for anyone to use.

Charter – Charter will offer free Spectrum broadband and Wi-Fi access for 60 days to households with K-12 and/or college students who do not already have a Spectrum subscription at any service level up to 100 Mbps. Installation is waived for new student households. Call 1-844-488-8395.

Access from AT&T – <https://www.att.com/shop/internet/access/#/> Installation fee is waived, cost is up to \$10 per month for 10 Mbps. No term commitment, no deposit. In-home Wi-Fi modem included.

Frontier Fundamental Internet Service - <https://frontier.com/fundamental-internet> \$19.99 per month (plus taxes) includes \$14.99 for service and \$5 router charge. Speeds range depending on type of service. No term commitment. No installation fee.

Spectrum Internet Assist -- \$14.99 per month (plus taxes), \$5 more for in-home Wi-Fi, 30 Mbps. No term commitment, modem included.

T-mobile – Participating schools can receive up to \$200 per student to put toward mobile internet devices, including hotspots, laptops, and tablets, 24-month service agreement required. Sign a two-year contract on a qualifying unlimited plan for \$20 per month. More details: 877-634-0256
